


Learning at home grid 5 – Reception

Activities in **bold** have a sheet you can use.

Everyday	Maths	Topic
Practise reading and learning the Read Write Inc sounds. Focus on the single sound but if you are confident, you can move onto sounds with two letters. Can you learn the rhymes for each letter?	Practise writing your numbers. Remember to take your time and to start from the top.	Using the sheet with the four trees, think about what a tree would look like in winter, spring, summer and autumn. Talk to a grown up about how the leaves change.
Try reading and learning the RED words. Remember RED words can't be sounded out; you just need to learn them. Start by learning 3 words, then 5 words etc... How many can you learn?	Go on a shape hunt around your house. How many squares can you find? Which shape can you find most of? Maybe you could make a chart showing all the shapes you found and how many? Could you look for 3D shapes? Cube, cuboid, cylinder etc...	Cut out each part of the flower and put it together. Talk to a grown up about what each part of the flower does. Can you write a sentence about the function of each part?
Read a book at home every day. You could take turns with an adult, reading a page and then swapping over, or you could read to someone in your family, a soft toy or a pet. When you have finished, ask a grown up to ask you questions about it. Some questions they could ask are in this pack.	Sort all your toys in different piles, for example put all the cars into a pile, all your teddies into another pile etc... Practise counting how many of each pile you have. How do you write that number? what would happen if you had one more or one less?	Using the picture of sunflowers by Vincent Van Gogh – Can you create your own? You could paint, collage, colour, draw, make etc... Be creative! 
Try reading some of the alien words. These help you to confidently recognise the sounds you have been learning.	Use two dice. Roll them both together and practise adding the two together. What is the most you have made? What is the least? If you don't have a dice you could use the online one below or use dominoes, playing cards etc... https://www.random.org/dice/?num=2	Draw a picture of yourself in each season. What clothes would you wear? What activities would you do?
