

Hythe and Dymchurch (Year 1) Home Learning Grid, Term 5


Make sure you read at home at least 3 times each week.

<p>Complete at least 1 activity per week and colour the activity you have done using the key below.</p> <p><i>Remember you can draw, write, build, collage, etc.</i></p>	<p>In English, we will be looking at 'Traditional Tales'. Share a traditional tale (book or film) with an adult. Draw a picture of your favourite character and write a few sentences about that character and where they live.</p>	<p>Design a new outfit for a character from your favourite traditional tale (Cinderella, Puss in Boots, Prince Charming, Wicked Witch etc...) You could draw & colour, paint or collage.</p>	<p>Design a healthy meal on a plate using collage/drawings.</p>	<p>Practise counting backwards from 100 to 0. When you can do this, try starting from different numbers, eg 82, 81, 80, 79. Then 54, 53, 52, etc.</p>
	<p>Find 5 different price labels at a shop up to £1. Write them out and record how many 10p coins and how many 1p coins are needed to make that amount. You can draw some coins to show your answer.</p>	<p>Make a list of your favourite sports.</p>	<p>Draw a plant, then label the different parts (stem, root, leaf, flower.) Add colour to your work.</p>	<p>Learn some number bonds within 20, e.g. (16+3, 17+2, 18+1 etc..)</p>
	<p>Plan a traditional tale of your own, made up from parts of several stories, e.g. a good character from Jack in the Beanstalk, a bad character from The Three Pigs, a setting from Cinderella. Draw pictures to show your story. Add sentences to explain the main events.</p>	<p>https://learnenglishkids.britishcouncil.org/sites/kids/files/attachment/short-stories-the-lucky-seed-transcript.pdf</p> <p>Read the story of the Lucky Seed. Write and draw what the seed needed and what he grew into.</p>	<p>Go for a walk with an adult and describe the setting using your senses. What can you see, hear, smell, touch, taste?) Write it down/take photos to record.</p>	<p>Learn to count in 10s to 100. If you can already do this, learn to count in 10s from <u>any</u> number, eg 3, 13, 23, etc. 6, 16, 26, 36, etc. Make sure you understand that you are adding 10 each time.</p>
	<p>Write your weekend news, using full stops and capital letters. Make sure you also use clear finger spacing. Use Fred-fingers to spell your words.</p>	<p>Make a 3D model of a plant or a flower, using recycling resources.</p>	<p>Make some flower shaped biscuits with an adult. Take a photo and bring them to school to share.</p>	<p>Learn all your doubles to 10 by heart. Use this website to help.
