Complete at least 1 activity every day and colour the activity you have done.	<p>Division – sharing a quantity into halves. Count out even numbers of objects e.g sweets, small toys, biscuits, plastic bricks. Share them equally between yourself and one other person. You each have a half. You should have exactly the same number of objects.</p>	<p>Division ladybird halves. See the ladybird worksheets and put the correct number of spots on each side of the ladybird.</p>	<p>Ladybird doubling. See the ladybird worksheets and put the correct number of spots on each side of the ladybird.</p>	<p>Double your money. Use pennies (1p coins). You need 10 pennies. Put 3 coins in a pot. Say "Double your money" and put 3 more pennies in the pot. How many in the pot now? So double 3 is 6. Repeat this activity with different amounts.</p>
	<p>Story – The North Wind and the Sun fable. Who manages to get the man to take his coat off? The Sun or the Wind? Can you make some simple stick puppets or masks to retell the story in your own words?</p>	<p>Weather songs There are lots of songs about the weather. Can you learn to sing or say one? Can you make a percussion instrument that you can shake? Does it sound like the rain? Hint - filling an empty plastic bottle with pasta, lentils or rice sounds good.</p>	<p>Story – The North Wind and the Sun fable. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zw6qxbn Can you draw 4 pictures to retell the story? Use them to tell someone the story. Maybe you could make a picture book of the story with a sentence for each picture.</p>	<p>The seasons Look at photographs of a tree in spring, summer, autumn and winter. What do you notice? Draw the leaves on the tree outline worksheet. Match the seasonal clothes and animals on the coloured trees worksheet.</p>
	<p>Continue to look at your High Frequency Words. There are 5 sets of words to learn. How many of them can you read and spell now?</p>	<p>What clothes do you wear on cold winter days? What clothes do you wear on warm sunny days? Cut out and sort the clothes.</p>	<p>Months Learn to read the months of the year. Can you put them in order? What is your birthday month? See months labels.</p>	<p>Can you make a sun hat out of paper? You can make one by folding a large sheet of paper or newspaper. There are lots of simple ideas online.</p>
	<p>Science Some animals live in cold places e.g penguins, polar bears, seals. Can you find out how they keep warm? Draw a picture of your animal.</p>	<p>Draw or paint a picture of seasonal trees. Maybe you could even add some animals that might live in or near the trees.</p>	<p>Summer senses walk. Go on a walk outside and look for signs of summer. What can you see? smell? hear? touch? Take photos or draw pictures. Maybe you could write a sentence to describe each of the signs of summer e.g I can hear noisy seagulls.</p>	<p>Nature Walk Go on a walk outside and look for some of the things/animals on your picture list. Tick them off as you find them. How many can you find? Don't worry if you can't find all of them! See Nature Walk sheet.</p>
