

## Learning at home grid 6 – Reception

Activities in **bold** have a sheet you can use.

Everyday	Maths	Topic
<p>Continue to practise reading and learning the Read Write Inc sounds. Focus on the single sound but if you are confident, you can move onto sounds with two letters. Can you learn the rhymes for each letter?</p>	<p>Practise writing your numbers. Remember to take your time and to start from the top.</p>	<p>Paint a picture of Folkestone. Perhaps you could paint a picture of the beach? The hills? The view from your bedroom window? Choose your favourite place and paint it.</p>
<p>Continue reading and learning the RED words. Remember RED words can't be sounded out; you just need to learn them. Start by learning 3 words, then 5 words etc... How many can you learn?</p>	<p>Practise writing your numbers 1- 10 in the correct order. Can you make your own number line? Can you write your numbers 1-20 in the correct order?</p>	<p><b>Can you make a Queen's guard? Use the sheet to make a guard. Can you make your own guard?</b></p>
<p>Read a book at home every day. You could take turns with an adult, reading a page and then swapping over, or you could read to someone in your family, a soft toy or a pet. When you have finished, ask a grown up to ask you questions about it. <b>Some questions they could ask are in this pack.</b></p>	<p><b>Count and add all the different seaside objects. Remember to use the seaside counting sheet and the seaside adding sheet together.</b></p>	<p>Pretend you are the King or Queen of England. Make yourself a royal crown to wear. You could use felt tip pens, craft materials etc... Take a photo of yourself wearing the crown.</p>
<p>Try reading some of the alien words. These help you to confidently recognise the sounds you have been learning.</p>	<p>Can you practise counting in your 2s? 2,4,6,8,10,12,14,16,18,20 Maybe you could help pair up the socks when they have been washed?</p>	<p>Using junk modelling, try to make a London landmark. You could make the London Eye, Big Ben, Buckingham Palace etc...</p>

<p>Talk to a grown up about living in Folkestone. Write down the 5 things you love about Folkestone.
