## Pirates

**When we think** of pirates we think of Pirates of the Caribbean, The Swashbuckle Pirates or Captain Hook. **But who** were pirates? Pirates were people who attacked and robbed ships at sea. Most piracy happened during the 1600s and 1700s **and** this was thought of as The Golden Age of Piracy. Pirates of this time **usually** wore a jacket, shirt and trousers or breeches. A bandana was common and the captain might have worn a tricorne hat. Most people think pirates only existed long ago, **but** there are pirates still around today in places around the world.

Pirates needed small, fast ships called sloops or schooners **so** that they could chase and catch bigger, slower ships. Their small ships often got damaged in the attack **so** they would sometimes steal the bigger ships as well as the cargo. Pirates would often try to trick other ships by flying the same flag as them **but** as soon as they got close they would swap flags and put up a Jolly Roger instead.

When it comes to treasure, pirates stole whatever they found on other ships. **Sometimes** this was gold and silver coins called doubloons and pieces of eight. They also stole useful items such as medicine, weapons and soap.

Pirates used lots of different weapons. They had cannons for firing cannon balls at other ships. They used cutlasses to fight with, **which** were easy to swing about. They tied pistols onto their clothes so they wouldn't drop them.

The most famous of all pirates is Blackbeard! Did you know he grew his beard down to his waist **and** put lit fuses in his hair to make himself look more terrifying? Calico Jack sailed alongside two female pirates: Anne Bonny and Mary Read. He liked to drink lots of rum! Pirate John 'Jack' Rackham was an English pirate captain **who** designed the Jolly Roger flag. Grace O'Malley is remembered as the pirate queen **who** fought the English. She was born in County Mayo in western Ireland in 1530. She cut off her long auburn hair and dressed in boy's clothes, just so that she could go to sea with her father. **Interestingly** back then, it was thought to be bad luck to have women on a ship. When her sons were arrested she wrote to Queen Elizabeth I to ask for her help. It has been suggested that they became friends.

**As far as we know**, pirates never used treasure maps. This could have been an idea which was made up in stories. **Similarly**, it is only in storybooks where pirates bury their treasure, as most real pirates spent their money as soon as they got back to dry land!

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




## Tasbih Beads



Beads hanging around the mosque to help worshippers think about Allah.


## Mihrab

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
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
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# Why Do People Go to a Mosque?
